- Tasting kits are sold at the Chamber information booth.
- Each kit includes three tasting cups, one voting ticket, a spoon & napkin, and promotional items from our sponsors.
- Those who purchase the kits will present a tasting cup for a taste of chili at the chili booth(s) of their choice.
- The public must present an <u>unused</u> tasting cup for each taste.
- Tasting cups <u>are not allowed</u> to be reused.
- For every three tastes, the public gets one vote for their favorite. The more tasting kits purchased, the more chili gets tasted, and the more votes are cast!
- Chili is also collected for judging by a panel of judges.
- Contestants are encouraged to provide "extras" to serve with the chili (i.e. cheese, onions, crackers, etc.)
- Contestants are encouraged to decorate as there will be judging for Most Festive booth in addition to awards for Judges Choice, and People's Choice. Awards are presented at the end of the day.

#### Rules - Use the list below to make sure you're ready!

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☐ All booths/cooking stations must have canopies. Canopies are not provided.
□ Canopies must be weighted down to avoid being blown due to wind gusts.
□ Chili entrants must provide a container to collect voting ballots and identify it so the public will know where to place them.
□ Check in at the loading area (gravel parking lot at 7th & Whiteaker) for your booth assignment.
□ Entry into the festival area will be done on a first come first serve basis to unload. Booth set-up is from 7:30 to 9:00am. Chili must be ready for tasting by
11:00am.
□ If chili is prepared in a certified kitchen, participant is required to have a copy of their certified kitchen license on site.
□ Food handlers must wear food approved gloves
□ <b>All</b> entrants must have <u>at least</u> 5 gallons (more is recommended) of prepared Chili for each team entered.
□ <b>All</b> entrants must have 3 wash containers: soapy water, bleach water, and clean rinse water.
□ Entrants must supply their own trash containers. All trash must be bagged and placed in the dumpster at the end of the event.
□ <b>Each</b> team must have one head cook, who is responsible for the behavior of all team members.

- Chili entrants are prohibited from "selling" or "giving away" any product from their booth. You must register a separate vendor booth space.
- Chili Cookers: A Food Handler's permit is not required but encouraged.
- Chili CAN BE prepared off site.
- No open fires. Only propane or camp stoves are allowed.
- Cooks must wear hats while preparing food.
- If chili is **not** prepared in a certified kitchen, we are required to post a notice of that at your booth.

□ **Teams** must be registered and entry fee must be paid at least 3 (three) days prior to the event.

- All food must have temperature maintained at +140 degrees for prepared food and + 40 degrees for unprepared food.
- Food areas must have a neat, clean appearance.
- Participant behavior should be appropriate for a family oriented event.
- Music levels should not interfere with other participants.
- **Electricity** will not be provided. Please do not use generators.
- One pint of chili will be picked up from each team by an official around 12:00 PM. The Chamber will provide these containers.
- Please note: Tasting cups are not allowed to be reused. The public must present an unused tasting cup.
- All cook shacks and materials must be removed by 5PM. Booth area and event site should be cleaner than you found them.
